Structure at three levels is crucial: overall text structure, paragraph structure and sentence structure. A paragraph should contain only the information that relates to its topic or controlling idea.

1. Make a List of Your Topics

4. Make a List of Your Words

The words you encounter in academic writing are often more complex than those encountered in everyday writing. This complexity makes learning them more difficult, especially for students. But, with a bit of planning, students can make the task much easier.
